ORIENTATION WORKSHOP ON UNIVERSITY-BASED DRRM "Diliman DRRM Summit 2016" 3-4 May 2016

Background:

Disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) in the University entails the institutionalization of an organizational mechanism that will address both the **disaster risk reduction** and **disaster response** at the University level and in every academic and administrative unit. With the establishment of the U.P. Diliman Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (UPD DRRMC) with five (5) Sub-Committees and DRRM Committees at the unit level – the latest issuance on the assignment of main duties being Memorandum Order No. MLT-15-138-A, dated 13 November 2015 – it is imperative to have a common and shared perspective on DRRM, organizational set-up, and expectations towards a more coordinated program of activities for the University's DRRM initiatives.

This entails the conduct of a series of orientation workshops in batches among the members of the UPD DRRM Committee and Sub-Committees and of the Unit DRRM Committees.

First in the series, the "Diliman DRRM Summit" is being facilitated by the UPD DRRM Sub-Committee on Institutional Training chaired, ex-officio, by the Vice–Chancellor for Academic Affairs. The summit workshop shall be followed in the succeeding weeks and months by parallel workshops on university-based DRRM for the different sectors (6 sectors of students, faculty, non-teaching staff, locators, residents, and visitors) and geographical zones (15 zones).

Objectives:

The Orientation Workshop on University-Based Disaster Risk Reduction and Management aims to provide the members of the UPD DRRM Committee and Sub-Committees with the basic orientation on the operationalization of DRRM in U.P. Diliman. After the Orientation Workshop, the participants will be able to:

- 1. Utilize the perspectives and basic processes (prevention, mitigation, adaptation, preparedness, response, and recovery strategies) in disaster risk reduction and management in a university setting, both community-based and science-based;
- 2. Clarify the roles, functions, expectations and activities of the UPD Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee, its Sub-Committees and the Unit DRRM Committees;
- 3. Develop the overall plan of action by the UPD DRRM Committee and Sub-Committees (with initial focus on fire hazard); and
- 4. Develop the protocols for coordination and communication among the UPD DRRM Committee and Sub-Committees, the Unit DRRM Committees, and the general community.

Annex 1: Memorandum Order No. MLT-15-138-A dated 13 November 2015, Part II – UPD Committee and Sub-Committees

Main Duties of UPD DRRM Sub-Committees per MLT-15-138-A subject to review and confirmation in Workshop 1: Functions and Challenges:

"The UPD DRRM Committee and its five (5) Sub-Committees shall see to it that full coordination is attained for the safety, security and sustainability of the entire UP Diliman community through disaster resilience."

Hazard Management Sub-Committee:

- (1) Develop, promote and implement a **Hazard Management Plan** particularly the mapping and monitoring of hazards in relation to various exposures and vulnerabilities in the vicinity of the University.
- (2) Coordinate with other organizations inside and outside the University with similar functions.
- (3) Propose and request appropriate resources.

Exposure Management Sub-Committee:

- (1) Develop, promote and implement a **Student Preparedness Plan** to reduce their exposure such as, but not limited to, organizing, training, planning, and equipping.
- (2) Facilitate the accreditation of National Service Reserve Corps reservists and their organization into a school-based NSRC unit, preferably any existing student organization with recognized DRRM program.
- (3) Propose and request appropriate resources.

Vulnerability Management Sub-Committee:

- (1) Develop, promote and implement a **Business Continuity Plan** particularly provision of emergency resources.
- (2) Coordinate with other organizations especially those essential to the sustenance of critical functions for the University.
- (3) Plan and recommend prioritization of resources to reduce vulnerability prior to any disaster event, and aid early recovery and medium-term rehabilitation after any disaster event.


Capacity Management Sub-Committee:

- (1) Develop, promote and implement an **Emergency Management Plan** particularly among University personnel, including preparedness of personnel in terms of capacity or capability building.
- (2) Coordinate with Barangays within the University and vicinity.
- (3) Propose and request appropriate resources.

Institutional Training Sub-Committee:

- (1) Develop, promote and implement an alternative learning environment for use in emergency.
- (2) Develop, promote and implement, in coordination with the other Sub-Committees, a **DRRM Training Plan** for various University sectors.
- (3) Coordinate with other training organizations inside and outside the University with similar functions.
- (4) Propose and request appropriate resources.
